
### Pet Emergency Checklist: What to Have and Do

- LEASH, HARNESS, OR CARRIER ALWAYS KEEP THESE ACCESSIBLE FOR QUICK EVACUATION
- FOOD & WATER (3-5 DAYS' SUPPLY) DON'T FORGET BOWLS AND A MANUAL CAN OPENER IF NEEDED
- MEDICATIONS INCLUDE A LIST OF INSTRUCTIONS AND DOSAGE IN A WATERPROOF BAG
- COPY OF MEDICAL RECORDS KEEP PROOF OF VACCINATIONS AND ID TAGS
- PET FIRST-AID KIT BANDAGES, ANTISEPTIC, TWEEZERS, AND VET CONTACT INFO
- COMFORT ITEMS BLANKET, FAVORITE TOY, OR SOMETHING FAMILIAR TO REDUCE ANXIETY
- WASTE SUPPLIES LITTER BOX & LITTER, POOP BAGS, OR PUPPY PADS
- CURRENT PHOTO OF YOUR PET IN CASE YOU BECOME SEPARATED
- EMERGENCY CONTACT LIST INCLUDE YOUR VET, LOCAL SHELTERS, AND NEARBY ANIMAL HOSPITALS
- SAFE SHELTER PLAN KNOW WHERE PET-FRIENDLY SHELTERS OR HOTELS ARE LOCATED
- MICROCHIP INFO MAKE SURE IT'S REGISTERED AND UP TO DATE "IF YOU NEED ASSISTANCE VERIFYING THE MICROCHIP IS UP TO DATE, OUR STAFF WOULD LOVE TO HELP!

### Scratch That! Itchy Pet Awareness Month Is Here

If your pet is doing more scratching, licking, or head-shaking than usual, it's not just in your head—it could be a sign something deeper is going on. Welcome to Itchy Pet Awareness Month, where we shine a light on what might be behind all that itching and how you can help your furry friend feel more comfortable.



### What's Behind the Itch?

Pets itch for lots of reasons, and while the occasional scratch is totally normal. persistent itching could point to:

- Allergies (to food, pollen, dust, or fleas)
- Parasites (yes, even indoor pets can get fleas or mites!)
- Dry skin (common in seasonal changes or due to bathing issues)
- Skin infections (bacterial or fungal)
- Underlying medical conditions (like hormonal imbalances)

Whatever the cause, chronic itching isn't just annoying-it can lead to skin damage, hair loss, and even infections. That's why it's important to take it seriously.


### When Scratching Gets Serious

Some signs your pet's itching might need a vet visit:

- · Constant licking, chewing, or scratching
- · Red, inflamed, or flaky skin
- Hair loss or bald patches
- · Head shaking or ear scratching
- · Odor from skin or ears

### What Can You Do?

The good news? Help is just a visit away! We can work with you to uncover the cause of your pet's discomfort—whether that means allergy testing, dietary changes, flea control, or medication. The sooner we get started, the sooner your pet can start feeling better.
